

WORLD WAR I HISTORICAL CHARACTER DRESS-UP

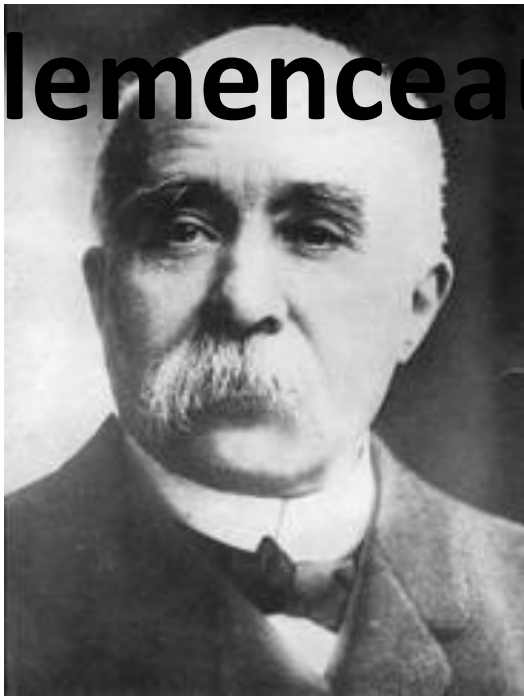

Character Cards: Cut on the single solid lines and fold on the dashed lines. This will create a double-sided card for each character. This can be used different ways: leave standing on the table in front of an assigned child to indicate his/her assigned character. Punch a hole on either side of the top corner of the card and string with yarn so they can be worn around the neck, or mount to a popsicle stick or straw so they can be held.

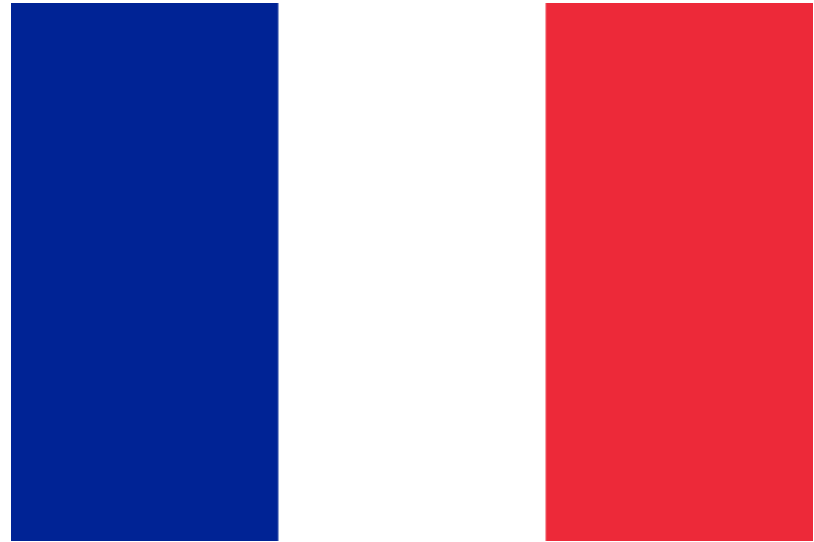
World War I, 1914, and 1918 cards: These are optional, but can also be cut out and mounted to a popsicle stick or straw to be displayed appropriately.

“Dress-up” Cards: Cut out the mustaches and eye glasses (be sure to cut out a circle in the inside of the glasses). Use cardstock and consider laminating if you plan to use more than once.

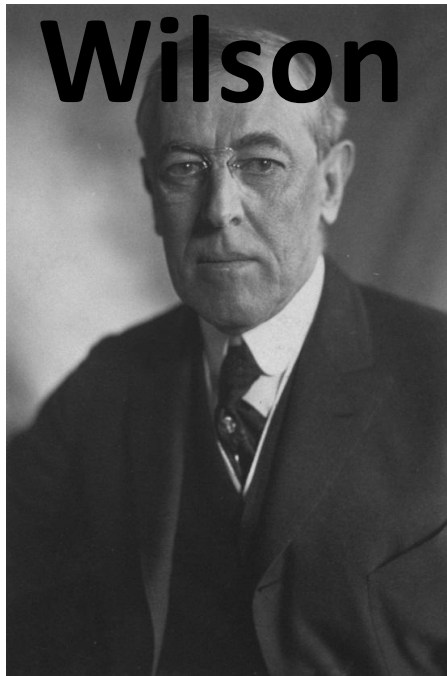

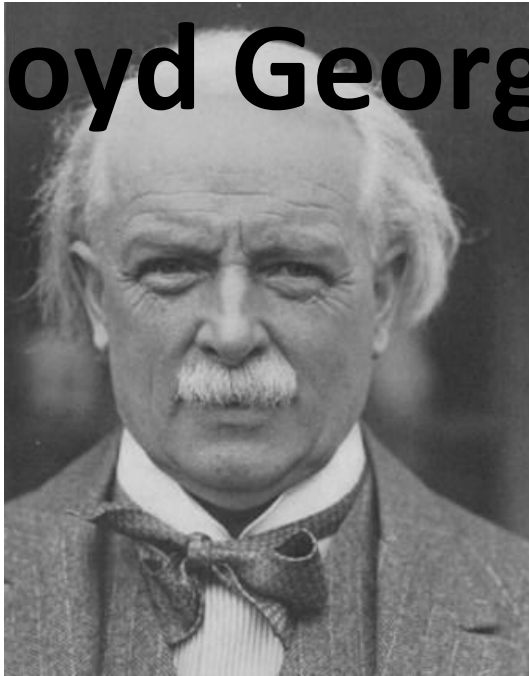

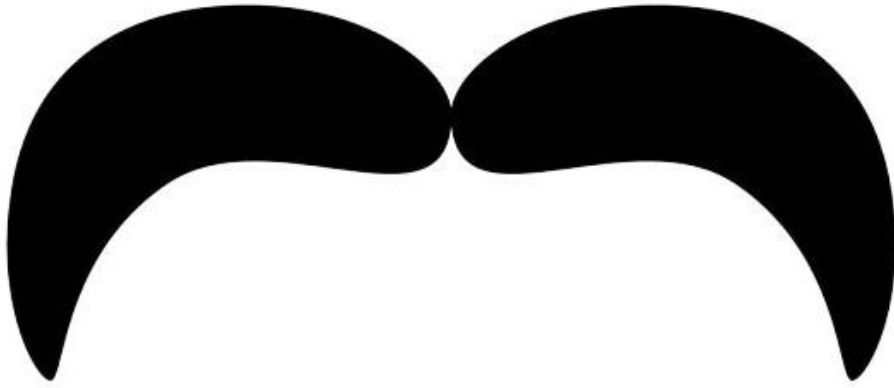

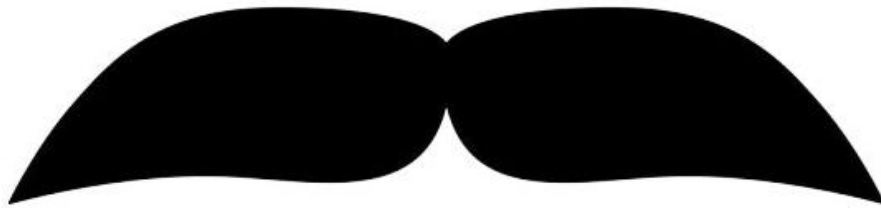
Clemenceau's Mustache



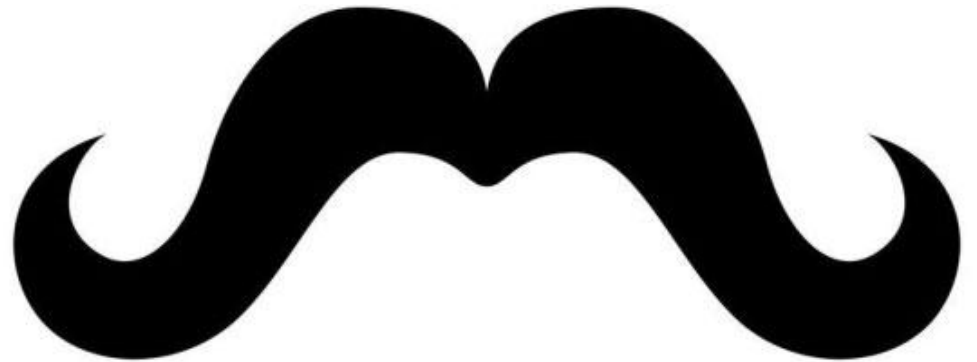
Wilson's Glasses
